The Wayne County Museum began in 1986 when the Goldsboro Woman's Club donated its stately Jeffersonian style building, located in the historic district of downtown Goldsboro, to the Wayne County Historical Association. Since the official opening in 1988, the museum has sponsored two to three special exhibits each year. The museum seeks to inform and entertain a wide group of people through varied and diverse exhibits.

In 1996 the Museum has added a permanent Civil War Exhibit featuring a Diorama of the Battle of Goldsborough Bridge and information on General Sherman's occupation of Goldsborough. As a result of the exhibit the Museum is now on the North Carolina Civil War Trail with the North Carolina Department of Travel and Tourism.

The aim of the museum is to collect, preserve, study and exhibit objects illustrating the history of man and nature in Wayne County and the surrounding area of Eastern North Carolina. The Museum is open to the public Tuesday and Thursday from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM, Saturday from 1:00 to 4:00 PM and Sunday from 1:30PM to 4:30 PM. Admission to the Museum is free.

Tax deductible annual memberships are available and include student - \$2.00, individual - \$15.00, and family - \$25.00 rates. Benefits of membership include a subscription to our bi-monthly newsletter *Collections*, discounts at the Museum gift shop, advance notice of special events and invitations to members only functions, parties, workshops and children's programs.






### **American Girls Storyhour**
