The Treasurer's report was given and there was \$6945 in membership dues. The membership is 157 with 10 new members.

#### Old Waynesborough Commission:

We want to thank the over 150 folks that came out to the Blessing of the Grounds for our Indian Village and the 2500 that supported our Spring Festival. We have had a super year and the next one starting in July promises to be even greater.

All of our teams are now operating under full steam and the candidates for Directors and co-Directors are all highly qualified and knowledgeable in their respective areas. Our goals have been set and will be explained at our annual business meeting on Sunday, June 25, 2000 at the Historic Village. The meeting will start at 4 PM and we will have a BBQ at 5PM. The cost will be \$10 and reservations must be made by June 23 through the Visitors Center at 919-739-9989.

The main items of business will be the election of officers for the next two years, reports on team accomplishments, goals for the next year from our Strategic Plan, and the kick-off of our annual membership drive. The Old Waynesborough Society has two missions and the funding for each is different. The County and the City of Goldsboro on a 60/40 split fund the Visitors Center, which serves all of Wayne County. The Historic Village obtains all of its funds from donations by the public. Your entire donation except for the postage on the envelope goes into the restoration of the Historic Village. That gives a breakdown of 1% for administration and 99% for restoration. Very few other

charities can promise even close to that. We do it through the work of 50 dedicated volunteers that serve on the five teams that make up the Commission, the governing Board of the Society. These teams have put together their budgets and we have arrived at a goal of \$30,000 for 2000-2001.


